KINGDOM VISION FOUNDATION exists to make quality eyecare accessible and affordable for those who cannot afford private healthcare.

We currently run two clinics in Bloemfontein (at Anchor of Hope and the University of the Free State) where patients receive free eye tests and affordable glasses — usually at a cost lower than one or two days of minimum wage.

KVF also serves as a training facility for UFS optometry students, giving them supervised clinical hours while multiplying our impact in the city.

FEEDBACK

- In the past year, KVF tested over 4 000 people. Of these, more than 2000 received glasses, each at an affordable price point.
- Thanks to the Generosity Fund, we were able to sow R40 000 into KVF.
- Through our citywide partners, we launched a frame drive, with 20+ businesses and schools collecting second-hand frames. These frames are refurbished at the UFS clinic and reused, keeping costs low and making glasses accessible for those in need.
- Waiting times at government hospitals can stretch to 18 months or longer, but KVF's turnaround time is around two weeks — a life-changing difference for patients.

Looking ahead to 2026

The need is great, with an estimated 9 000 people on the public hospital waiting list in Bloemfontein alone.

To meet this demand, KVF is preparing to double its testing capacity by adding six more cubicles at the Anchor of Hope site.

- Renovations: R200 000
- Equipment per cubicle: approx. R200 000
- Total for six new cubicles: R1.2 million (plus R200 000 for renovations).

This expansion will increase total testing stations from 6 to 12, allowing KVF to help double the number of patients each year.

Looking further ahead, KVF also hopes to establish a new clinic in Trompsburg in partnership with UFS, extending affordable eyecare into the rural Free State.
